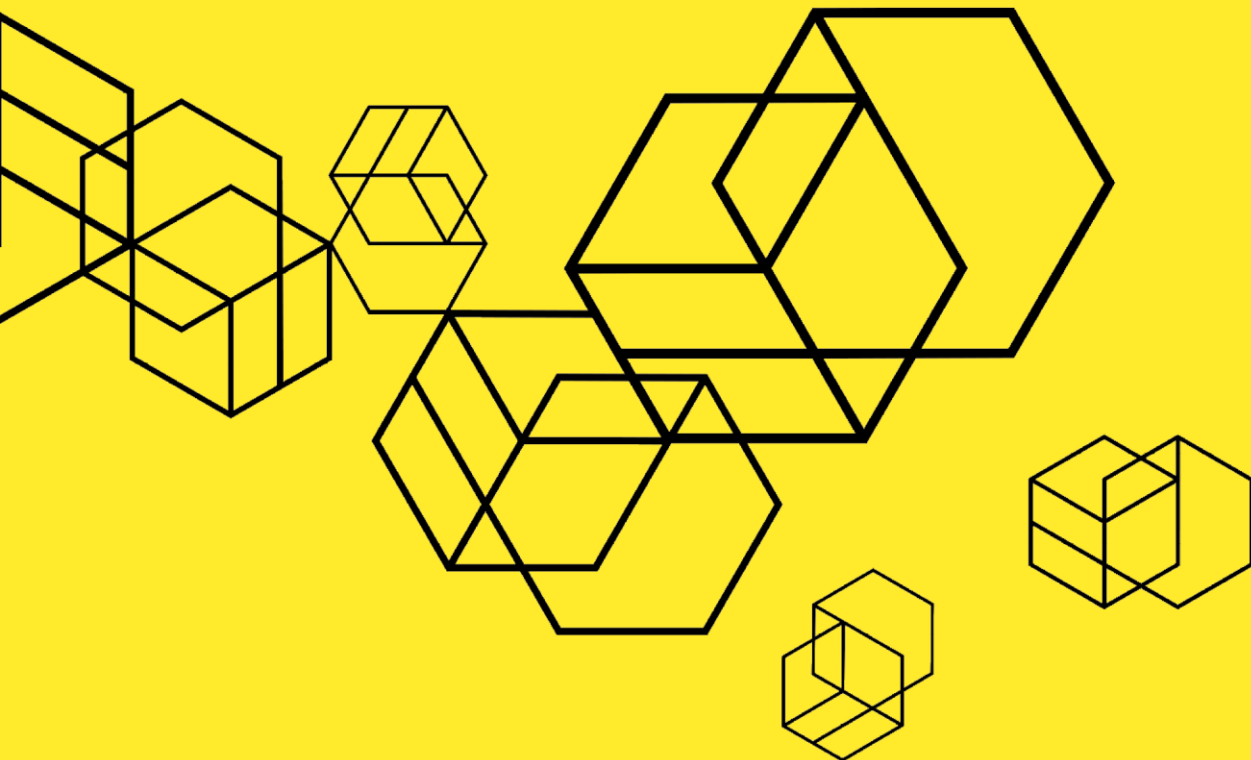

Social Innovation Relay

Rules of the Game





1. RULES OF THE GAME

Set up of the relay

During the workshop three to four groups will be formed. Each of these groups will embark on a relay in which they crowdsource input for each other's learning question. The way this will be done is as follows:

- A group consists of four people, each with their own learning question. Each group has a name and separate workspace on Slack
- Each week the learning question of one person will be posted in the group so that it can be answered by all group members. This learning question has been sharpened during the workshop.
- Group members will reply to this question as soon as they can - with a deadline of one week later.
- You will crowdsource input from within your own network and your personal experience in response to this learning question. This input can consist of tips such as: tools and methodologies, names of people or organisations to get in touch with, sharing personal experience, reading tips etc.
- You can post your input on the Slack workspace as the week goes along and involve others to do the same. You can also choose to use different social media and offline channels.
- The answers of the group members will build on each other by taking the previous answer into account.
- Participants from other groups are welcome to join in the conversation, but the commitment to respond is within your own group.

What the organising team will provide

- Theoretical framing and content during the kick-off workshop and the webinars.
- Practical tools to (collectively) reflect on the impact for you & your activities.
- An online learning environment with Zoom for webinars, Slack for dialogue and document exchange.
- A closed workspace on SLACK, to allow you to share your questions and answers in a safe environment
- Access to people in networks of the organising team and group supporters



- Support during the relay, such as the facilitation of knowledge exchange, answering questions, access to our ZOOM online meet-up & webinar tool and support with communication.
- Each group will have a host assigned to support & facilitate the group learning process. Your process supporter is your first contact point when you have any questions. During the workshop in [xx], we will collectively decide which group will cooperate with which supporter.
